General Reminders:

Punctuality

Supervision is provided by staff members from 8.50am-9.00am every morning and class begins at 9am sharp. Please support pupils to be on time for school daily.

Attendance

We continue to ask for your support in improving our school attendance for the year ahead. Good attendance and punctuality are important life skills to teach. Under the Education Welfare Act 2000 parents must inform the school if their child will be absent from school on a school day and the reason for the absence. Under current legislation (Education Welfare Act 2000) the school must notify the National Educational Welfare Board (TUSLA) if a child is absent for more than 20 days in a school year.

Attendance Campaign - Attend Today Achieve Tomorrow

In an effort to improve our attendance as part of our DEIS planning, we will begin an attendance drive directly after the Easter holidays, with each class working towards full attendance, ultimately leading to a class reward. We would ask all parents to support us in this attendance drive.

Collecting a Child from School Early

Children may not be removed early from class unless for HSE appointments or a family emergency. The removal from class causes significant disruption to classes and the running of the school. In the event that a child has a HSE appointment:

- 1. Inform the school via Aladdin (at least one day in advance).
- 2. The pupil will be brought to the collection point (green gate).
- 3. Pupil is signed out by parent.
- 4. All early removals are recorded on Aladdin.

Communication with Teachers/New School Email

Staff members can be contacted by making an appointment through the school office. Please email <u>secretary@ticknevinns.ie</u> if you wish to make an appointment to speak to your child's teacher or need to pass on a message to a class teacher. If you need to contact the school during the day the most effective method is by emailing the office. Please note that the only emails in use **to contact the school are** <u>secretary@ticknevinns.ie</u> or <u>office@ticknevinns.ie</u> The drop off and collection time is very busy and staff are needed for supervision to ensure the safety of children. Please do not enter the school grounds at this time without a prior appointment.
