Anti-Bullying Week

We are holding an Anti-Bullying Week from 7^{th} - 10^{th} February, which incorporates Safer Internet Day. The aim of this week is to promote positive relationships within the whole school community. The Student's Council will be organising some fun activities for the week.

Safer Internet Day

Safer Internet Day is an EU wide initiative to promote safer internet for all users, especially young people. It is taking place this year on February 7th. We have organised an online safety workshop facilitated by the local Gardaí for pupils from 2nd -6th class. The workshop will take place in school on Friday, 10th February. The focus of the workshop will be educating the children on how to use the internet in a safe and positive way.

Catholic Schools Week

This year Catholics Schools Week will be celebrated in our school from 23^{rd} - 27^{th} January. This year's theme is 'Walking Together in Faith and Love'. Because we are a Catholic School, this is a very special week in our calendar and it will be celebrated in many different ways in each classroom.

St. Brigid's Day Mass/Grandparents' Day

St. Brigid's Day marks a special day in our school community, as St. Brigid is the patron saint of our school. We are delighted to be able to hold our annual St. Brigid's Day mass in the school again this year. Mass will take place on Wednesday, 1st February at 12pm. All are welcome but we extend a warm invitation to all grandparents. This invitation to grandparents affirms and values their place not only in the lives of their grandchildren, but in the community in general. The Parents Association have kindly volunteered to provide tea/coffee afterwards. Any donations of baked goods for our grandparents would be

greatly appreciated and can be dropped to the school on the morning of the mass. We are also conscious of the fact that not all children have grandparents living and also that not all grandparents will be able to make it to our school but we will pray for them on the day.

St. Brigid Crosses

The making of St. Brigid's crosses has been a tradition in our school for many years. The sale of St. Brigid's crosses form a big part of our fundraising in the school year. We would be very grateful if parents would send in bunches of rushes and we can start making crosses in preparation for mass the weekend of 28^{th} and 29^{th} of January and for our annual St. Brigid's Day mass at school on Wednesday, 1^{st} of February. We would be most appreciative if people, particularly adults could make some at home and give them to the children to bring to school. The Parents Association will be looking for volunteers to help sell crosses at the weekend masses. If past pupils/parents could come to school on Wednesday afternoon on the 18^{th} and 25^{th} January to assist us also, it would be of great benefit.

Gymnastics Lessons

The pupils from all classes will get the opportunity to take part in a 6 week program, with each of the 3 classrooms getting a 30 minute session weekly. The coach will bring all equipment needed and sessions will take place indoors. The cost is just ≤ 15 per child for the full 6-week program. The dates are as follows: February 23^{rd} , March, 2^{nd} , 9^{th} , 16^{th} , 23^{rd} & 30^{th} .

Peace Proms 2023

The pupils from 3^{rd} - 6^{th} class will attend the Peace Proms on Sunday, 5^{th} February in the RDS. The boys and girls are busy preparing and are looking forward to this event. Further detail to follow this week.

Swimming Lessons

Pupils in 2nd-6th class will be starting swimming in Edenderry Swimming Pool. The sessions are: February 7th, 14th, 21st, 28th and March 7th. The children will be brought to and from the pool by bus and will receive swimming instruction at the pool from qualified instructors. The instructors will put each child into a group according to their ability. All levels, including absolute beginners will be catered for. Please note that the swimming pool has increased prices since last year. The Parents Association will continue to subsidise the cost of the bus. Swimming is part of the P.E. curriculum and is compulsory for all children. It is an activity that they have missed out on due to Covid restrictions and is an experience they thoroughly enjoy while acquiring a life skill.

ALDI Rugby Stickers

The school will be participating in the collection of Rugby stickers to be in with a chance of winning \leq 50,000 for the school. A sticker is given for every \leq 25 spent and the promotion begins on 16th January and ends on 23rd April. If you collect stickers please send them into the school with your child.

School/Club GAA Coaching

HSE Advise in relation to Respiratory Illness

The HSE recently sent advice to all schools in relation to flu and respiratory illness. The information was sent to all via email for your reference. They advise that children should not be sent to school if they are feeling unwell and particularly if they are experiencing a temperature, a sore throat and cough. They should have no temperature or sore throat for **48 hours** before returning to school. A cough can last for a longer period of time, but once your child is feeling well, they should be fine to attend school. If your child requires Calpol/Nurofen to reduce a temperature, however slight, they should not be sent to school.

Late Arrivals/Early Departures and Absences

Children arriving late to school or leaving early must be singed in/out by an adult. Please input late arrivals/early departures on Aladdin Connect in advance. All absences must be explained. This can be done by selecting the reason on Aladdin Connect. We appreciate your cooperation with this matter. Please contact the school if you are having any issues with the Aladdin Connect app.

Coming to School

Reminder – you are asked to drop your child(ren) to school as close to 8.50am as possible. Supervision is provided for from 8.50am each morning and we ask that you do not drop them off outside the school gates before this time.
